Guidelines for Domestic Off-Campus Study Program Proposals:

Domestic off-campus study programs provide opportunities for experiential education beyond those available through existing Marietta College programs. Participation in domestic off-campus study programs has both financial and curricular implications. Currently, financial aid for these programs is transferrable, and credits earned through approved off-campus study programs are considered "in residence" for the purposes of graduation requirements. Furthermore, credits earned are transcripted and calculated into the student's cumulative, major, and minor grade point averages.

A domestic off-campus program must meet the following criteria in order to receive the approval of Curriculum Committee:

1. The mission of the program must be consistent with that of Marietta College.

2. The program must enhance the student's academic experience through significant experiential learning opportunities not available through the College's on-campus programs. Specifically, a minimum of 50% of the credits must be directly associated with experiential education (i.e., internship, research, creative activity or service learning).

3. The program must be affiliated with a regionally accredited U.S. college or university through which credits and grades will be reported.

4. The evaluation of a student's performance in the experiential component of the program must be conducted by the affiliated institution's faculty.

5. The program must provide adequate support services such as assistance in securing housing.

6. The Provost's signature is required prior to submitting the proposal form.

The Director of the Career Center or an Academic Department that seeks the approval of the Curriculum Committee for a domestic off-campus program must complete the Domestic Off-Campus Study Programs Proposal Form available on the <u>Curriculum</u> <u>Committee website</u>.
