

Dr. Morgan found that as coalitions include more mature security organizations, combatants kill peacekeepers at a significantly lower rate and magnitude.

Dr. Yi Selected as **Election Observer**



■ Taiwan's next general election is sched-

uled for Saturday, Januarv 16. 2016. and Dr. Yi has been selected by the Taiwanese Election Committee to be part of the International Observation Mission, which consists of leaders from Europe. North America, and Asia who will observe and monitor the election to ensure its legitimacy. The

election may be very significant in that polls indicate Taiwan posed to elect its first female president, Tsai Ing-Wen, and also her opposition Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) may win control from the long dominant Kuomintang (KMT). This could bring major domestic policy changes, and also affect Taiwan's relations with China and the U.S. Dr. Yi is director of MC's China Program, based in Beijing.
