

OHIO DRAGONFLY DAYS by Bob Glotzhober



On Saturday and Sunday July 21 and 22, 2007 will be the first Ohio Dragonfly Days (final name not selected yet), to be held at the Ohio Agricultural Research & Development Center (OARDC) in Wooster, Ohio – with field trips at a wide variety of wetland and stream habitats in the region. Keynote speaker for the event will be **Dennis Paulson**, Odonata and Ornithology worker of note and recently retired as Director of the Museum at the University of Puget Sound. Dennis is a renowned speaker and if nothing else were happening, this would be the meeting to attend. But, of course, there is more. Other speakers will include David McShaffrey, Bob Glotzhober and Larry Rosche. Saturday afternoon and Sunday will be filled with field trips to eight or ten special places nearby to observe and document dragonflies and damselflies. Tentative field trip sites include Killbuck Marsh, Funk Bottoms, Wooster Memorial Park (a well kept secret), Brown's Lake Bog, Mohican State Park/Forest and Singer Bog. Final details are not yet set - but watch for information. Registration will include two meals, all talks and field trips and will be kept as low as possible to entice a great group - goal of about 200 people. This event will also launch a new publication from the Ohio Division of Wildlife, "Common Dragonflies & Damselflies of Ohio" by Dave McShaffrey and Bob Glotzhober. All participants will receive a copy of this, which is designed similar to the existing "Common Butterflies and Skippers of Ohio" that the DOW distributes. The event is sponsored by the Ohio Division of Wildlife along with the Greater Mohican Audubon Society, the Ohio Odonata Society, and the Ohio Historical Society (with perhaps some others to be added). The plan is to keep field trip groups small - 20 or less. We already have commitments from a number of folks to be trip leaders/co-leaders (2 for every group), but still need a few more. Leaders & co-leaders will have their registration fee and basic meals covered.

[*Note to potential leaders*: During the event we will limit collecting to catch/show and release. The Friday prior to the event will be a reconnaissance day for those leaders interested, and (pending permits) collecting will be permitted on that day.]

Fisher Auditorium at OARDC in Wooster, Ohio will be the epicenter of events. The Best Western Plaza, 243 East Liberty Street, Wooster Ohio is holding 36 rooms for Dragonfly people. Folks will need to request a room with the **Dragonfly Conference** to get the special rate of \$69.00 plus tax (which is a huge discount from their normal price of \$109.00). Also available for use by folks attending & staying at the hotel will be a conference / hospitality room, *The Imperial*.

Oviposition, photo links, field accounts. from the Odonata list-serv

An exchange of postings about male damselflies standing erect and motionless while in tandem sparked several responses and links to nice photos on the subject. Initial question posted was : *Would be interesting to note if others report (or have observed) Argia males standing erect with their wings still versus Enallagma males standing erect (when they do so) with their wings moving, while ovipositing in tandem.* Certainly many folks in our OOS membership have observed this behavior while watching Damselflies in the field ?

If you go to this website (http://content.denison.edu/cdm4/browse.php) and search for *signatum* in the box at the upper right, you'll see male Orange Bluets in sentinel position, with wings flapping, and descending into the water while in tandem with a submerged female. From our own *Tom D. Schultz, Ph.D., Denison University*.

2007 Field Trips ? Collecting / Photographic potentials ? by Steve Chordas III

If you plan on organizing a collecting / photographic / observation field trip or know you are venturing out to specific localities during 2007, consider announcing it in the Dragon-flier. Kokosing River Odonata ? The Kokosing River is beautiful river, wadeable in may areas, clear running water and has nice bank habitats. However, our odonate knowledge of the river is considerably lacking. Located in Coshocton, Morrow and Knox Counties, the Kokosing River is a potentially excellent Odonata hunting ground. Steve Chordas set black light traps at several locations along the Kokosing and its tributaries while at Ohio State in the late 1990's. These collections produced many interesting finds of caddisflies (Trichoptera), mayflies (Ephemeroptera) and Crane flies (Tipulidae). Bob Restifo has intended (and attempted) to observe, survey and collect Odonata from the river over the past few years but has not had the cooperation of mother nature during any attempt. Efforts for a 2007 excursion would be highly anticipated. If any plans arise to visit the Kokosing, please let others know as interest by several members is currently high for such an event.
