INTERNSHIPS 2015-16:

- More than 125 internships for academic credit.
- The majority were paid internships.
- Marietta College received the Great Lakes Career Ready Internship Grant to help provide monetary incentives for employers and students who participate in internships.
- The Arthur Vining Davis Foundation awarded Marietta College money to support entrepreneurship programs. For the second summer in a row, some of the funds have been allocated to provide stipends for students performing internships in an entrepreneurial setting with an entrepreneurial spirit.



EVANS ENDOWED INTERNSHIP PROGRAM 2016:



Lydia Emery Jones is the recipient of The 2016 Robert Evans Internship Endowment. Lydia is a sophomore with a double major in Geology and Petroleum Engineering. Originally from Northeastern Ohio, Lydia is spending the summer 2016 in Pittsburgh interning with XTO Energy, a subsidiary of Exxon Mobil. She will be serving as a completions and productions intern.

The Robert Evans Internship Endowment was set up by an alumnus several years ago and awards \$5,000 to one qualified student who participates in a summer internship at a for-profit organization, specifically a major national or global organization. The \$5,000 can be used for relocation, travel, housing, meals, related equipment purchases and other living expenses.

SUMMER ENTERPRENEURSHIP INTERNSHIP PROGRAM 2015 & 2016:

The Marietta College Summer Entrepreneurship Internship Program provides an opportunity for students to earn a stipend of \$4,000 to support their summer internships with entrepreneurs and/or entrepreneurial initiatives in various stages of business or project development. Internships can take place in the U.S. or abroad at for-profit companies, non-profits, governmental or non-governmental organizations, and for profit and nonprofit social ventures. Internships may take place with sole proprietorships (individuals, including artists or consultants) or emerging organizations, as long as a plan for adequate supervision and mentoring for the intern is included.
