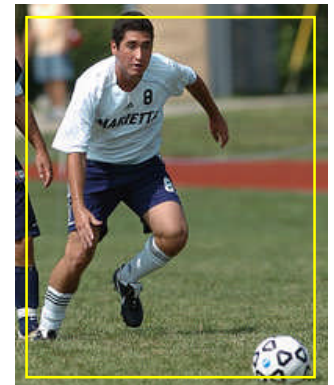
ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL RUSH – PLEDGE 10 NEW MEMBERS

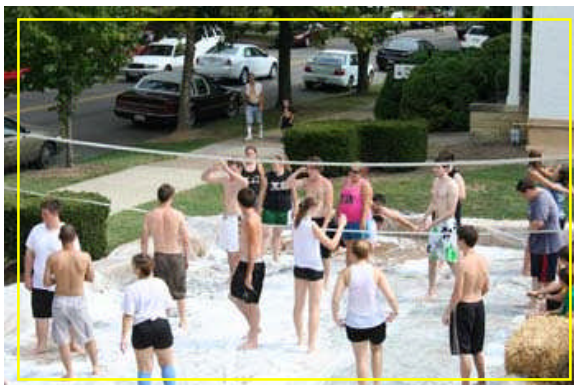
MARIETTA DELT SUCCEEDING ON SOCCER FIELD
