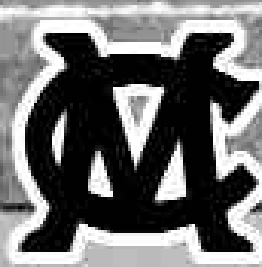
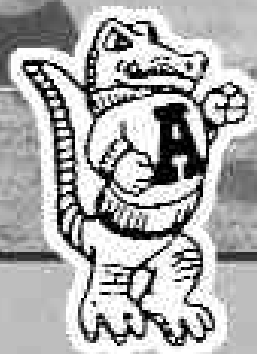

MARIETTA COLLEGE

Marietta College can trace its beginnings to the establishment of Muskingum Academy in Marietta, Ohio, in 1797. Marietta College received a charter from the State of Ohio in 1835 to offer college-level degrees. Founded by local citizens, the College has always been independent and nonsectarian. The campus includes more than 40 buildings on 120 acres located two blocks from downtown Marietta.

The fall enrollment at Marietta was 1,060, including students from 42 states and 10 nations. The male-to-female ratio is 50-50. The faculty-to-student ratio is 1-to-12.

Settled by Revolutionary War veterans in 1788, Marietta was the first permanent settlement in the Northwest Territory — the lands north of the Ohio River and west of Pennsylvania. The Indian mounds within the city attest to the fact that Marietta has been an important community for centuries. Marietta saw its greatest growth during the oil boom in the late 19th century.

Now a city of 15,000, Marietta still retains many of the characteristics and much of the atmosphere of a small New England town. Its historical significance makes Marietta a popular location for tourists from around the nation. The city is located at the confluence of the Ohio and Muskingum Rivers and many of the community's activities are associated with the rivers.

MIDEAST REGIONAL PREVIEW

After three years at Canton's Thurman Munson Stadium, the NCAA Division III Mideast Regional has returned to Marietta College's Pioneer Park, one of the finest baseball facilities in the nation.

The four-team tournament is expected to be highly competitive as games run Thursday through Saturday.

Ohio Wesleyan, who won the North Coast Athletic Conference championship, is the No. 1 seed after compiling a 40-10 mark. The Battling Bishops ended the season on a high note by winning 14 of their final 15 games, including two impressive wins against Allegheny (Pa.).

Coach Roger Ingles has a solid club all the way around. Junior pitcher Matt Farmwald is one of the top hurlers in Division III after posting a 12-1 record with 59 strikeouts in 87 innings. Freshman Tyler Mott is 5-0 with a 3.95 ERA and sophomore Shaun Burchett is 5-1 with a 5.17 ERA.

Drew Caravella possesses the best bat for the Bishops. Caravella, a junior first baseman, is hitting .443 (78-for-176) with 16 home runs and 77 RBIs. Junior outfielder Shaun Rice has added 11 homers and 56 RBIs while batting an impressive .420 (74-for-176).

Ohio Wesleyan, playing in its 11th regional, is in the 4:30 p.m. game Thursday against No. 4 seed DePauw (26-17), a school from Indiana. The Tigers earned an automatic bid into the regional after defeating Southwestern (Texas) in the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Tournament.

Under the leadership of second-year coach Matt Walker, the Tigers are making their fourth regional appearance and first since 1979.

Pacing the DePauw offense is junior shortstop Jarrett Hunt with a .408 (69-for-169) average and senior first baseman Javair Gillett at .397 (69-for-174). Junior outfielder Jason Geringer leads the Tigers with four homers.

Sophomore Pat Creel and freshman Dave Edmonds each won five games for DePauw, while freshman Tyson Becker leads the squad with a 3.61 ERA with a 4-0 record. As a team, the Tigers have a 4.86 ERA. DePauw also led the SSAC with

a .956 fielding average.

In Thursday's first game, No. 2 seed Allegheny (Pa.) faces host Marietta, the No. 3 seed, at 1 p.m. The Gators are 29-9 and are making their eighth regional appearance. The Pioneers have never missed a Division III regional and are playing in their 26th consecutive tournament.

Both teams have World Series experience.

Allegheny finished third in the nation last season in its first championship showing. Marietta reached the World Series in 1999 and went 1-2. The Pioneers have won three national titles (1981, 1983 and 1986).

The Gators will attempt to rebound after losing the NCAC title to Ohio Wesleyan. Offensively, Allegheny is led by senior outfielder Ben Couch and junior pitcher Bob Spithaler. Couch is hitting .392 (51-for-130) with four home runs and 34 RBIs, while Spithaler is batting .361 (43-for-119) with five homers and 27 RBIs.

Allegheny also has a talented pitching staff, which is led by senior Scott Swinchock. The righthander is 7-0 with a 2.78 ERA and 66 strikeouts. Sophomore Josh Sharpless is 6-2 with a 3.54 ERA and junior Keith Gonzales is 4-1 with a 3.98 ERA.

Marietta, which has won 23 consecutive games and 12 straight OAC championships, will have one of the best pitching staffs in the tournament. Junior Matt DeSalvo is 14-1 with a 1.35 ERA and a Division III record 167 strikeouts. Sophomore Trey Lamb is 5-1 with a 0.99 ERA and Senior Kris Buirley is 8-1 with a 4.43 ERA and 76 strikeouts.

The Pioneers are led offensively by junior catcher Jay Coakley. The 2000 All-American selection is hitting .477 (72-for-151) with 17 home runs and 69 RBIs. Senior first baseman Mike Deegan is hitting .400 (64-for-160) with six home runs. Freshman outfielder Matt McLuckey has been hot of late, batting better than .600 while earning All-OAC Tournament MVP.

Freshman outfielder Andy Coble has also been a nice surprise for Marietta. He is hitting .424 (50-for-118) with 13 stolen bases. Senior shortstop Mike Menke has been playing consistent in the field and is hitting .380 (46-for-121) with one homer and nine stolen bases.

ABOUT PIONEER PARK

“If you build it ... they will come.”

Marietta College Head Baseball Coach Don Schaly has built it and they have come. It is Pioneer Park, the home of Marietta College baseball. They are the thousands of people who have enjoyed baseball at Pioneer Park as players, coaches or spectators.

When Schaly took over the Pioneer baseball program in 1964, the baseball team played its home games in Don Drumm Stadium. Not one to settle for mediocrity, Schaly refused to play at Don Drumm. He asked for a separate baseball facility and the College delivered.

Originally constructed in 1968, the natural grass field is built to major-league dimensions of 330 feet down the lines, 370 feet in the alleys and 410 feet to center.

The facility also includes two batting cages with artificial turf and a practice infield, both adjacent to the fully enclosed stadium. Bleachers run from dugout to dugout, complementing the three-story press box. A large electronic scoreboard oversees the park from left-center field keeping the fans up-to-date on the Pioneers' success.

Phase one of the Pioneer Park project was the addition of the three-story combination press facility, umpires' locker room, meeting area and concession stand. The project cost \$175,000 and began in July of 1988 with the demolition of the old center section bleachers. The money was raised through the tremendous effort of private donations, generous alumni support and countless volunteers from the Marietta community.

The labor, equipment and construction of the project fell under the umbrella of the Washington County Home-builders Association. Prominent individuals who contributed numerous hours of energy and time to the project include Ken Strahler, Bob Johnson (college trustee) and Paul Erb (former Pioneer Park supervisor).

The new facility has three covered floors. The roof provides a perfect place for cameras and television equipment. The first floor is a fully equipped concession stand. The second floor

includes a small locker room for the umpires, with a shower and a bathroom and a lounge area for the working press and games committees. The third floor is a double-level press box which can accommodate 26 people plus an organist. It is equipped with lines for eight radio stations and television.

Schaly, the catalyst behind Marietta College Baseball, spends as much time as he can at Pioneer Park. He has done everything from cutting grass and pulling weeds to laying blocks for the dugouts in 1969 and a new press box in 1988.

Despite having the best facility in NCAA Division III, Schaly was always looking ahead to something better. Phase two of the Pioneer Park Project was to add lights. Installation of a state-of-the-art lighting system was completed during the fall of 1994. A major donation by former Pioneer Terry Mulholland made the project possible. With the completion of the Pioneer Project, only two baseball fields in the state of Ohio have better lighting — Cinergy Field in Cincinnati and Jacobs Field in Cleveland. The \$325,000-plus lighting system makes the value of the Pioneer Park Project more than \$500,000. Around the same time, Marietta renamed the press box, Kent Tekulve Media Building and the road leading into and through the park Mulholland Drive.

The improvements to Pioneer Park suffered a minor setback in July of 1990. A tornado hit Pioneer Park knocking down fences and blowing the third-base bleachers over onto the field. The bleachers, backstop and several sections of fence were destroyed.

The Etta Express has enjoyed a great deal of success at Pioneer Park. The Pioneers have an enviable record in regular season play at Pioneer Park since its construction in 1968. The park has also seen numerous post season games (the Pioneers are 90-31 in post season games at Pioneer Park); including the NCAA Division III World Series from 1976-1987. Marietta's overall record at Pioneer Park is an astounding 649-78 (.893).
