## **A Diplomatic Experience**

Eight students from last fall's Middle East Politics class taught by **Dr. Schaefer** and **Kathleen Reddy-Smith** (71), a retired diplomat and last year's Schwartz

# **Faculty Activities**

Dr. Morgan (10) defended his dissertation titled Structure Matters: How Organizational Characteristics Affect Military Efforts last April at the University of Kentucky. The first chapter evaluates how differences in personnel sophistication and bureaucratic stratification influence battlefield efficacy. The second chapter examines how characteristics of military organizations influence the likelihood of alliance formation. The third chapter investigates how organizational traits of United Nations peacekeeping coalitions influence the frequency and magnitude of deliberate attacks on peacekeepers. Congratulations to Dr. Morgan!

Dr. Schaefer, Dr. Morgan, and Dr. John Poffenbarger delivered a paper titled "When Alliance Restraints Fail: The Domestic Turmoil Connection" at the Midwest Political Science Association meeting in Chicago last April.

Dr. Schaefer, along with Ms. Paula Lewis, directed the annual summer Seminar on International Politics for a group of 23 students and two faculty members from the University of International Relations of Beijing July 20-31, 2015. The UIR students attended classes, did group research projects on how Sino-U.S. cooperation might ad-

dress certain policy problems, and participated in various social activities. **Drs. Morgan** and **Tager**, and **Daley Buckwell**, also assisted with the

seminar.

Dr. Tager delivered a paper titled "Presidential Restraint in the Obama Administration" at the Southwest Political Science Association meeting in Denver last April.
