- Be accepted by the priority date of January 15, 2019, as a first-time freshman
- Meet the cumulative high school GPA requirement based on an official transcript and at least six semesters of work
- Meet the ACT composite score or SAT (critical reading and math components) score with a test taken within the past five years

Students who receive these scholarships must be enrolled full time in their first bachelor's degree program.
