Students enter the Environmental Studies major eager to learn more about the social issues surrounding environmental problems. What they receive at Marietta College is an interdisciplinary education that guides them through the sciences, social sciences and humanities aspects of the field.

By taking this liberal arts approach, our majors gain a deeper understanding of how people interact with the environment, the impact of that interaction and opportunities to improve environmental concerns.

Environmental Studies majors work individually and collaboratively with other Environmental Studies and Science majors on applied research and practicum projects to tie their scholarship into the study of local, real-world environmental problems.

Every April, students present their original research projects to their peers, faculty, staff and the community during All Scholars Day. Over the course of four years, Marietta College Environmental Studies majors develop the skillset to identify and solve problems, as well as talk about their work to peers and professionals in the field.
