## COMMUNICATION

## DEVELOPMENT

The Development Committee has been working in tandem with MC staff to identify six key goals. They are:

- Increase Day of Giving donors from 712 to 1000.
- Increase Alumni participation from this year's high of 18% to 20%; championing a "20 in 20" campaign throughout the year but especially at EOY.
- Develop a more inclusive and high-touch way to recognize our valued donors to The President's Circle.

- Highlight the importance/financial advantages of MCAA members participating in Planned Giving.
- Continue to stress the importance of 100% MCAA donor participation.

As Homecoming approaches, we look forward to hearing from you on how to best approach these goals, as well as your passion for achieving what we need to do to keep the institution we love so very much, strong, viable and ever responsive.

## NOMINATIONS

Nominations met August 8th to discuss some outstanding issues and update on progress:

- Alumni Relations Office is currently building the MCAA Board of Directors and Awards Nominations form to be electronically accessible.
- Working to clarify the recruitment process for MCAA Board members prior to nomination of the slate in February.
- Nominations will reconvene September 10th to set and prioritize goals for the 2019-2020 year and begin conversation on planning and identification of membership gaps in current Board make-up.

## **Trustees Summer Retreat Update**

he Board of Trustees of Marietta College met in July for a summer retreat. In addition to President Bill Ruud and members of the senior leadership team, twenty-one active trustees and one emeritus trustee were in attendance.

## ENROLLMENT

Vice President Scot Schaeffer provided an enrollment update, noting that Ohio has 195 institutions of higher learning and Marietta College continues to face significant competition for new students. Despite this, he opined that an increase in enrollment is reasonable and to achieve this the inquiry pool will need to be significantly increased. (As of August 18th, 2019, the current new student count is 404.)

Actions are being taken to revitalize international student recruitment and they have assigned a staff member responsible for recruiting for new graduate programs (Clinical Mental Health Counseling and Athletic Training). Provost Janet Bland reported that she has commissioned a feasibility study related to potential new graduate programs in Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy.

## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

The Board engaged in a discussion regarding the future of Information Technology at Marietta College, and noted the following key elements: Infrastructure and Connectivity; Security; Cloud Computing; Analytics and Data Science; Artificial Intelligence; Applications; Mobile Interface; Curricular Content; Partnerships with Technology Companies; and IT Capacity. An Ad Hoc committee will be formed to focus on these issues and appropriate strategic plan. Discussion ensued regarding the impact of technology on the student experience.

## ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

Provost Bland led a discussion on criteria to be used when considering how academic programs can support the vision/ mission of the College (both for existing programs and for potential new programs) and how to develop clear metrics for evaluating the efficacy of existing programs.

## COMMITTEE GOALS FOR FY 2019-2020

The leadership of each committee of the Board met to discuss their committee's goals for the coming year and these were reviewed with the whole Board so planning could begin for upcoming committee meetings.
