McDONOUGH MENTORSHIP PROGRAM (2015-2016)

Description:

The McDonough Center offers leadership development opportunities for students from all fields of study at Marietta College. McDonough Scholars, while going through the leadership program, can interact with a McDonough graduate whose career aligns with the student's professional plans. The main purpose of the McDonough Mentorship Program is to allow current leadership students to exchange ideas, seek advice, and expand their knowledge of leadership by interacting with a Marietta College graduate. Mentees may also ask their mentors to review resumes and talk about graduate school, transition to the world of work, etc. These contacts are made primarily through email exchanges.

Expectations:

For the 2015-2016 academic year, we will select <u>20 mentees</u> from Cohorts 26, 27, and 28. Once the mentor-mentee match is made, the McDonough Center will give the mentor's contact information to his/her designated mentee. It is the responsibility of the mentee to make the initial contact. Mentors expect to have contact with their mentees on a regular basis – once a month, at the most.

Required Mentorship Program Meetings:

Mentees are expected to attend <u>three</u> meetings with the Program Adviser, Program Coordinator, and all of the mentees (orientation meeting in the spring of 2015; fall 2015 meeting to review progress; celebration meeting at the end of spring 2016).
